The feathers on a raven's neck are longer than any other species of bird.

DESCRIPTION

The black feathers on the throat are longer than in other species, and a bird tends to extend these when calling. They make an 'ah-ah-ah-aaaah' sound.

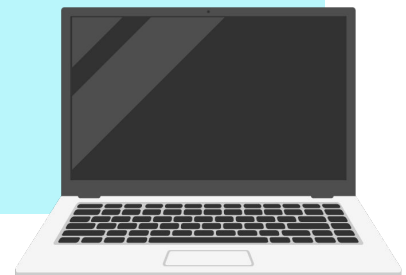
