Noisy Miners are a bold and curious bird. It has a mostly grey body with a black crown and cheeks, and a yellow beak.



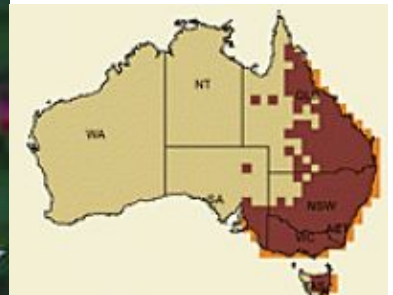

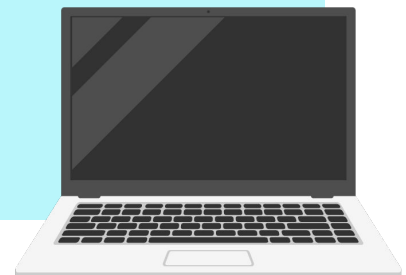
