The Powerful Owl is a large owl with a small head and a rounded tail. It is dark-grey above and off-white below, with a distinctive v-shaped chevron pattern. The eyes are yellow, set like a dark grey or brown mask. It has a sharp-tipped strong beak that it uses to kill the animals it eats.





Powerful owls eat great gliders and ring tailed possums. It will eat roosting animals. It eats both ground and tree dwelling animals.

Habitat

They live in open forests and woodlands as well as in sheltered gullies and rivers. They like wet forests with dense understories.

Breeding Season

The breeding season normally starts in May and continues until August. Then a cute baby powerful owl is born. If you're lucky enough you will hear a "hooing" sound in your backyard.
