Habitat

The breeding season is from March to August.

They eat and control the number of insects.

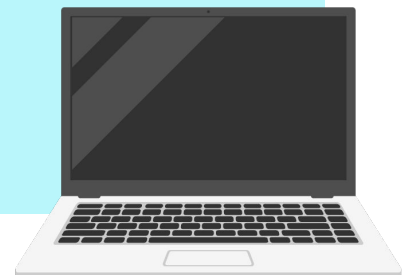
