

We are learning to (WALT): We are learning to model multiplication using repeated addition.

The process of repeatedly adding the same number is called repeated addition.


Activity 1: Roll and Record Roll 2 dice and record the numbers you rolled. Write the repeated number sentence and the answer.

Roll 1	Roll 2	Repeated Addition Number Sentence	Answer
3	4	4 + 4 + 4	12

This is a multiplication symbol 'x' and it means 'groups of'. So instead of repeated addition, we can use a multiplication symbol. 5+5+5+5 = 20 or $4 \times 5 = 20$ (4 groups of 5 make 20)
