## Mathematics

We are learning to (WALT): We are learning to model multiplication using repeated addition.
The process of repeatedly adding the same number is called repeated addition.


Activity 1: Roll and Record

This is a multiplication symbol ' $x$ ' and it means 'groups of'. So instead of repeated addition, we can use a multiplication symbol. $5+5+5+5=20$ or $4 \times 5=20$ (4 groups of 5 make 20)
